## County Officials Meet with Assemblymember Garcia at State Capital

**SACRAMENTO, CA** – On Wednesday, while attending the California State Association of Counties Annual Legislative Conference in Sacramento, District 2 Supervisor Luis Plancarte and County Executive Officer Miguel Figueroa met with Assemblymember Eduardo Garcia to discuss the Imperial County and how the County and Assemblymember's office can continue to communicate and collaborate to serve all those that live, work, and study in our region.
